MINUTES  
January 9, 2012

It was announced that Butte Fence and Irrigation is moving to a location on Kimberly Road and that Big Al's has closed.

Kathleen Noh announced that the School District will be asking the community to renew the \$300,000.00 supplemental levy on March 13. The polling places are the LDS Church on Birch Street and Crossroads United Methodist Church on Syringa Avenue. Several KBOA members volunteered to help support the levy. A Community Meeting to discuss school matters will be held on February 8 at 6:30 in the Middle School Commons. The levy is on the agenda.
